Dear Families,

On the back is our class's weekly reading log. Students are expected to read a minimum of 20 minutes at least 4 nights per week. After each reading session, students should then make a personal reflection on his/her reading. This reflection needs to be in connection to an event or character from the reading that day. Reading logs are due every Thursday.

Examples of a good reflection statement may be:

- When Miss Franny told Opal the story about her dad, it reminds me of visiting Papa Joe, who always tells me stories about when he was a little boy.
- Why did EB White have all the babies fly away? If I wrote this book, I would have had at least one spider decide to stay where his mom lived to keep Wilbur company.
- I've never heard of owls that live in the ground before. I wonder why the author chose owls instead of some other type of animal that kids could relate better to.

Non-examples to avoid:

- Miss Franny told Opal a story about her dad.
- All of Charlotte's babies flew away.
- There are lots of owls living in burrows in the ground.

Parents, before signing your child's reading log each night, please look over their reflection statement. Please check for a good reflection and assist your child with spelling and grammar before signing.
